



Request for Coaching Privileges and Letter of Expectation

The Vancouver Skating Club has been “closed” to non-Club coaching professionals since 2005, but has extended Guest Coaching privileges on a case by case basis, as approved annually by its Board of Directors.

All non-club coaches must now apply to the Vancouver Skating Club Board of Directors for permission to coach on our sessions.

The Vancouver Skating Club (VSC) values the Guest Coaches who use the ice times at our Club. With them they bring vast knowledge and experience to the sport of figure skating, which benefits the club and its skaters.

Permission, if granted, will apply to the current competitive skating year. Please ensure that your completed application is submitted to the Board on a timely basis.

The Guest Coach agrees to the following:

- To abide by the Coach’s Code of Ethics as stated by Skate Canada;
- To adhere to all policies and rules of the Vancouver Skating Club;
- To respect that the Canskate/ Jumpstart program is closed to all students referred by or taking private lessons from a Guest Coach. We encourage Guest Coaches to teach this level of skater in mini-group lessons on our Junior sessions;

- To respect that Guest Coaches do not have access to skaters enrolled in VSC Canskate/Jumpstart/Beginner StarSkate programs and
- To provide a WorkSafe BC Letter of Independence:
